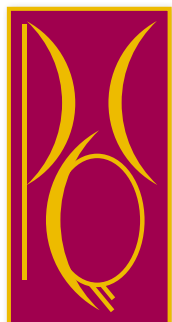


Funding our Objectives

About Palliative Care Queensland

Palliative Care Queensland is the peak representative body for palliative care and end of life care in Queensland, representing the interests and aspirations of all who share the ideal of *'Quality care at the end of life for all'*.

Palliative Care Queensland is also a membership based organisation, supporting the needs of both specialist and generalist health care professionals working within the palliative care and generalist settings.

What is Palliative Care?

Palliative care is a specialist style of care that provides coordinated medical, nursing and allied health support services to people who are terminally ill or people who have been diagnosed with a life-limiting illness that can no longer be cured. The aim of palliative care is to reduce suffering and to provide 'quality of life' at the end of life.

Our Role

As the peak body for palliative care, the major roles of Palliative Care Queensland include:

- **Improving the general public's awareness and understanding of palliative care and end of life issues;**
- **Supporting the professionals and volunteers working within the palliative care and end of life sector;**
- **Providing health professional education;**
- **Developing quality educational resources;**
- **Working with government and key industry stakeholders to support the equitable delivery of quality palliative and end of life care, and**
- **Providing one representative voice for the palliative care and end of life care sector.**

Membership

Palliative Care Queensland offers three types of membership; individual membership, organisational membership and corporate membership.

Individual membership is open to individuals either working in palliative care, or members of the community who have a specific interest in palliative care and who support the objectives of the organisation. Individual membership includes:

- Networking opportunities;
- PCQ bi-monthly newsletters;
- Newsflash service alerting members to important issues;
- Discounts to all PCQ educational sessions, conferences and events and
- Automatic addition to the Palliative Care Australia mailing list.

Organisational membership is open to any organisation wishing to be associated with the objectives of the association. Most commonly, these organisations will be involved with the delivery of palliative care, the provision of palliative care education, or have an association with palliative care through philosophy or similar strategic goals. Organisational membership includes:

- Networking opportunities;
- United lobbying capacity;
- PCQ bi-monthly newsletters;
- Newsflash service alerting members to important issues;
- Listing of organisational events, functions and employment vacancies in the PCQ bimonthly newsletter;
- Automatic addition to Palliative Care Australia mail list;
- Free supply (not including postage) of PCQ resource materials (to the value of \$200 per year), and
- Promotion/ listing through the PCQ website, newsletter and annual report.

Corporate membership is open to organisations interested in fostering the improvement of palliative care by supporting the organisation financially. Most commonly, corporate members will be public or private corporate sector entities with an interest in supporting palliative care e.g. pharmaceutical companies, banks, professional firms. Corporate membership includes:

- PCA bi-monthly newsletters;
- Link from PCQ website to corporate member website;
- Logo printed on the reverse side of PCQ's brochure, newsletters, annual report and website;
- Acknowledgement of membership in the annual report;
- Ability to include advertorials in PCQ newsletters (conditional);
- Ability to individually sponsor educational activities;
- Discounted information booths/displays at PCQ's biennial conferences;
- Inclusion of promotional material in conference bags;
- Networking with other members, and
- Automatic addition to Palliative Care Australia mail list.
